PASTOR'S LETTER

Dear Church,

Maybe I'm what kids today would call "basic" – but I *love* pumpkin flavored stuff. In fact, it isn't fall to me unless I drink at least one pumpkin ale. On a recent quest to my local *Pick-N-Save* it finally started to feel like fall. I had to bundle up and wear a light jacket. It was wet and cold outside. The sky was cloudy and dark. The leaves under my feet were sort of that soggy raisin-bran consistency. Then I was struck by something that made me think, "*Wait...it's actually fall?*" I noticed a blue mask in a pile of leaves and debris at the edge of the parking lot. This prompted me to touch my face and remember that I was still wearing one. Even though my senses told me it was fall, when I saw that blue mask in the orange and red leaves it filled me with a sort of dread. I realized...it's fall and we're *still* here!

This has been quite the year. The pandemic has caused many of us to lose our sense of time and normalcy. Our seasons haven't been marked by holidays but what we can and cannot do. COVID has required us to part with certain beloved traditions. There are lots of little reminders in our everyday lives that snap us back to the reality that we are not living in typical times. As a church, we continue to press forward as best we can amid the pandemic as well. It's fall and we're *still* here!

November is busy at Christ Church. This month we begin a new stewardship-themed sermon series, *Our Money Story*, in which we talk authentically about money and possessions. After all, Jesus spoke more about money and material stuff more than he did about faith and prayer. On November 8th we will celebrate our departed saints during worship for our Memorial Sunday. The service will be livestreamed for the first time ever. After worship that day we will also have our Annual Meeting. This year's meeting will be in-person and online – also a first in our congregation's 150-year history. We will continue to host Sharing-Our-Suppers every Friday evening in partnership with Divine Intervention. This ministry would typically only take place over the summer, but due to the pandemic there is an increased need for meal distribution in Bay View. Advent also begins on the last Sunday of November. What will a pandemic-Advent look like?



Although the pandemic has changed how we have had to navigate through the world, it has not slowed us down at Christ Church. We are just as busy as ever. For all the traditions we have had to part with this year, we will continue to move forward by trying new things together. *It's fall and we're still here!* I look forward to tackling November with you, Church. It may look differently than anything we have done in the past, but just as sure as the seasons change, we will get through these challenging times.

My wife Pam would be the first to testify that I like glitzy cars, motorcycles, and boats but I can tell you that there is nothing I want to possess more than being with my lost loved ones again. Is there anything on this earth that you desire more than being united with lost loved ones in a realm of peace without sickness or death? How can we even envision that, right? We are told there is such a place and yet we cannot see or even comprehend that place. We are told it can be ours through faith alone even though in this world we receive nothing we don't earn. We are told to love each other unconditionally even though we may be hurt severely, even unto death, even though sickness and death are the things we fear most. We have the spirit of Christ in us but we also have the desires of sin wrestling with that spirit in our hearts and minds constantly. It's no wonder God has such compassion for us.

CHRIST CHURCH ANNUAL MEETING UPDATE

I'm inviting all members of Christ Church to participate in this year's annual meeting on November 8th. Per our church bylaws the annual meeting must have a minimum of 40 people to conduct business.

The Covid virus situation has diminished in person church attendance so the Christ Church council has decided to add a "Zoom" element to our meeting. That means along with the 20 people we have been averaging for in-person worship, we would need at least 20 more members joining the meeting via "Zoom". A Zoom meeting is conducted via computer and allows 2-way conversation between the members attending the annual meeting at church, and each church member that logs onto the "Zoom" meeting. For those who have never participated before it is very easy and fun actually. First

you are sent an email invitation and given a link to simply “click” on. You will then download the “Zoom” application and follow a few prompts that are given to you on the computer screen.

You are then connected to and part of the annual meeting from wherever you and your computer are. Zoom has been used by many businesses and other organizations for many months and is safe, secure, and free. There may be occasional image pixelating (similar to receiving bad reception from a TV antenna – like slow motion imaging) but it’s momentary and does not affect the connection you have to the host (the annual meeting).

The first step to participating via Zoom is to send the church an email requesting an invitation to the annual meeting. The invitation and instructions will be emailed to you. We ask that you email the church by November 5th so we can be sure and get invitations and instructions sent to you in time for the meeting and so we know how many members we’ll have for the meeting.

The preference would be to have as many members come to church on that day as possible because there is ample social distancing seating available however if that is not possible, attending the meeting via Zoom is extremely important to the life and vitality of our church family. There are many decisions to be made including electing church leaders and adopting an annual budget. Please consider this option to a personal appearance if you would rather quarantine. – Dean Kothrade

ATTENDING WORSHIP DURING COVID 19

(A recording of the Sunday service will be posted online late afternoon or early evening as possible.)

*Welcome! Please **enter using the Lenox St. door only**. Please plan to arrive 15 minutes early.

***Sanitize** your hands upon entry either at the stairway or landing of the Lenox St. entrance.

*Have your **temperature taken** (must be below 100 degrees to attend worship).

*If your temperature is 100 or over you will be asked to return home to care for yourself

***Put on a mask** (You can bring your own or a disposable one will be provided)

***Register** with the usher. Provide your name and contact information.

*Using the **6ft social distancing** markers make your way towards the Sanctuary.

*If you need to use the rest room please sanitize the room according to the posted instructions.

***An usher will escort you to a seat**, (large print bulletins and hearing devices will be made available to those in need of them)

***Offerings** and envelopes can be placed in the offering trays on your way in or out of the sanctuary.

*On Communion Sundays you will be invited to take a **disposable wafer and cup** as you enter the sanctuary.

*After worship, the **ushers will direct you out of the sanctuary** using the Lenox St. exit.

*Please use the **hand sanitizer as you exit the Sanctuary**.

*An **outdoor informal coffee** hour will be held outside of the Lenox st. entrance following worship.

Additional Information

*Video Screens will be used for worship.

*Collection plates will not be passed. Donations should be placed in the trays upon entering or leaving the Sanctuary.

*Communion trays will not be passed. Disposable elements can be picked up prior to entering the Sanctuary.

*Prayer requests will be announced by the Pastor. Please submit them to Pastor Dan or Debbie during the week by phone or email.

*At this time there will not be any childcare or nursery care available.

*The only rooms currently open for use on Sunday mornings are the Sanctuary and restrooms.

*The Chapel will only be opened by an usher for seating if all seating is utilized in the Sanctuary.

CLASSES AND MEETINGS DURING COVID 19

If your group/class would like to return to meeting at the church building, please do the following so we can properly sanitize and prepare the room.

*Contact the church office to reserve a room for your desired meeting date.

*You will be assigned a room that will fit the size of your group for proper social distancing.

*Upon entering the building please wear a mask and use the hand sanitizer at the Lenox St. entrance.

*Sign the attendance sheet on the clipboard that will be found in your room.

*When your meeting is completed please clean all door handles, tables, chairs, and surfaces that were used or contacted during your meeting. Each room has a caddy equipped with wipes/spray, gloves and paper towels.

*Initial the attendance sheet that the room has been sanitized.

*Prior to exiting the building, once again, please use the hand sanitizer at the Lenox St. door.

NEED: SHARING OUR SUPPERS (SOS) VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

Every Friday our church is the food distribution site for 40 restaurant prepared meals, bottled water, and 45 bag lunches. Those who come for food are homeless or referred to us from Bay View Community Center. Since the pandemic, Divine Intervention has been unable to provide face to face services for the homeless in Bay View. Pastor Karen from Tippecanoe Presbyterian Church has coordinated this meal distribution through a variety of church contacts and organizations along with Jim Wick. The restaurant meals are provided through Meals Matter Movement and the lunches are prepared by individuals from churches in the support group for Divine Intervention.

How can you help?

Be the Christ Church building representative. Responsibilities include: Disinfect and set up of the outside serving table, signage and cones for distancing; bring up the water from the refrigerator and coolers for keeping food cold/warm; assist with meal drop off and distribution; Disinfect and return coolers, signage, table, to the basement and sanitize the areas used before leaving the church. The time required is 4:45 PM to approximately 6:15 PM on a Friday night of your choosing.

Donate heavy duty disposable plastic forks and knives. Please drop them off at church during office hours or on a Sunday. They can be left outside of the church office.
