## PASTOR'S LETTER



Dear Friends,

*The light shined in the darkness and the darkness did not overcome it.* Throughout the month of January, we have been exploring scriptures which reveal or show forth the identity of Christ during worship. This season is called Epiphany. Every Gospel lesson shows us a glimpse about whom Jesus was, what he did, and what he stood for.

Our month began with a distressing situation that took place at the US Capitol building in Washington DC on January 6<sup>th</sup>. We took the opportunity to talk about the significance of being careful with our words and the intentional word choice used by the evangelists to describe Jesus' baptism by John. How odd and curious that God's Beloved would also come alongside us to be baptized in the Jordan River—a rite of repentance and renewal! Words are important in the Bible. We, too, should be careful with our words.

We also talked about Jesus being rejected for preaching a difficult word of change and justice in his hometown congregation. The people who knew him as a child wanted to throw him off a cliff for preaching about the breadth of God's love and justice. We remembered the legacy of Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr who also preached a message that was not easy for people to hear. In fact, his vision would lead to his assassination.

Throughout January we have had a whirlwind of challenging events as a country. Many of us jokingly thought that 2021 would be some sort of cosmic *tabula rasa* where we would all start with a clean slate. However, between the events of January 6<sup>th</sup>, the impeachment of the president a second time, the threats of violence surrounding the inauguration, and the ever-present threat of the pandemic and its economic fallout have led many of us to lose hope. But, in a world of darkness, the light shines in the darkness and the darkness does not overcome it.

Throughout the rest of the Epiphany season, we will continue to talk about Jesus and the light he brought into the world through stories that illuminate who he was and who he came to serve.

I am hopeful that this light can shine in each of us so that we can help illuminate the dark spaces of our world and the corners of our own hearts.



As the season of Lent approaches halfway through February on Ash Wednesday, I am hopeful we can take the lessons from Jesus to heart and prepare ourselves for our 40-day wilderness journey. It is hard to believe we are still worshiping remotely and amid a pandemic a year later, but the light shines in the darkness and the darkness will not overcome it.

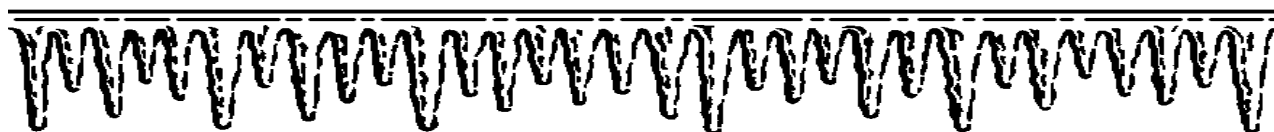

## NEED: SHARING OUR SUPPERS (SOS) VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

Every Friday our church is the food distribution site for 40 restaurant prepared meals, bottled water, and 45 bag lunches. Those who come for food are homeless or referred to us from Bay View Community Center. Since the pandemic, Divine Intervention has been unable to provide face to face services for the homeless in Bay View. Pastor Karen from Tippecanoe Presbyterian Church has coordinated this meal distribution through a variety of church contacts and organizations along with Jim Wick. The restaurant meals are provided through Meals Matter Movement and the lunches are prepared by individuals from churches in the support group for Divine Intervention.

### How can you help?

Be the Christ Church building representative. Responsibilities include: Disinfect and set up of the outside serving table, signage and cones for distancing; bring up the water from the refrigerator and coolers for keeping food cold/warm; assist with meal drop off and distribution; Disinfect and return coolers, signage, table, to the basement and sanitize the areas used before leaving the church. The time required is 4:45 PM to approximately 6:15 PM on a Friday night of your choosing.

Donate heavy duty disposable plastic forks and knives. Please drop them off at church during office hours or on a Sunday. They can be left outside of the church office.
