Today marks the first Sunday of Christmas and the last Sunday before the year's end. In today's service we light the *Christ* candle. The 126th Psalm says, "When the Lord restored the fortunes of Zion, we were like those who dream..." In the Bible the whole ensemble of characters in the Christmas story were dreamers. They received dreams. They discovered them. They responded to God's dream for the world. Indeed, they invite us to dream with them. God's dreams for us are not alone. In today's scripture, Simeon and Anna could not keep silent. They witnessed Jesus' divinity in action and were compelled to speak up. In words, in memories, in songs, and in dreams.


So today, as we prepare to hear your word read aloud,

Old Testament

[Isaiah 61:10-62:3 \(ICB\)](#)

Isaiah is the longest and arguably the most important of the prophetic books. It covers Israel's history before, during, and after the exile. Isaiah offers the full range of God's prophetic message – from words of judgment to words of promise. Isaiah portrays God as a mighty creator and the gentlest comforter. Isaiah is quoted more in the New Testament than any other prophet in the Hebrew Scriptures.

The Lord makes me very happy.

All that I am rejoices in my God.

The Lord has covered me with clothes of salvation.

He has covered me with a coat of goodness.

I am like a bridegroom dressed for his wedding.

I am like a bride dressed in jewels.

¹¹ *The earth causes plants to grow.*

And a garden causes the seeds planted there to grow.

In the same way the Lord God will make grow what is right.

He will make praise come from all the nations.

Because I love Jerusalem, I will continue to speak for her.

For Jerusalem's sake I will not stop speaking.

I will speak until her goodness shines like a bright light.

I will speak until her salvation burns bright like a flame.

² *Jerusalem, the nations will see your goodness.*

All kings will see your honor.

Then you will have a new name.

The Lord himself will give you that new name.

³ *You will be like a beautiful crown in the Lord's hand.*

You will be like a king's crown in your God's hand.

New Testament [Luke 2:22-40 \(ICB\)](#)

In today's Gospel lesson, Jesus is presented in the Temple. Simeon, a man who was aging and hard of sight is able to literally see God's salvation in the baby Christ. Anna, an aging prophetess, bears witness to the divinity of the baby Jesus.

²² *The time came for Mary and Joseph to do what the law of Moses taught about being made pure. They took Jesus to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord.* ²³ *It is written in the law of the Lord: "Give every firstborn male to the Lord."* ²⁴ *Mary and Joseph also went to offer a sacrifice, as the law of the Lord says: "You must sacrifice two doves or two young pigeons."*

²⁵ *A man named Simeon lived in Jerusalem. He was a good man and very religious.*

He was waiting for the time when God would help Israel. The Holy Spirit was in him. ²⁶ The Holy Spirit told Simeon that he would not die before he saw the Christ promised by the Lord. ²⁷ The Spirit led Simeon to the Temple. Mary and Joseph brought the baby Jesus to the Temple to do what the law said they must do. ²⁸ Then Simeon took the baby in his arms and thanked God:

²⁹ "Now, Lord, you can let me, your servant, die in peace as you said.

³⁰ I have seen your Salvation with my own eyes.

³¹ You prepared him before all people.

³² He is a light for the non-Jewish people to see.

He will bring honor to your people, the Israelites."

³³ Jesus' father and mother were amazed at what Simeon had said about him. ³⁴ Then Simeon blessed them and said to Mary, "Many in Israel will fall and many will rise because of this child. He will be a sign from God that many people will not accept. ³⁵ The things they think in secret will be made known. And the things that will happen will make your heart sad, too."

³⁶ Anna, a prophetess, was there at the Temple. She was from the family of Phanuel in the tribe of Asher. Anna was very old. She had once been married for seven years. ³⁷ Then her husband died and she lived alone. She was now 84 years old. Anna never left the Temple. She worshiped God by going without food and praying day and night. ³⁸ She was standing there at that time, thanking God. She talked about Jesus to all who were waiting for God to free Jerusalem.

³⁹ Joseph and Mary finished doing everything that the law of the Lord commanded. Then they went home to Nazareth, their own town in Galilee. ⁴⁰ The little child began to grow up. He became stronger and wiser, and God's blessings were with him.
