## **CLASSES AND MEETINGS DURING COVID 19**


If your group/class would like to return to meeting at the church building, please do the following so we can properly sanitize and prepare the room.

## **NEED: SHARING OUR SUPPERS (SOS) VOLUNTEERS NEEDED**

Every Friday our church is the food distribution site for 40 restaurant prepared meals, bottled water, and 45 bag lunches. Those who come for food are homeless or referred to us from Bay View Community Center. Since the pandemic, Divine Intervention has been unable to provide face to face services for the homeless in Bay View. Pastor Karen from Tippecanoe Presbyterian Church has coordinated this meal distribution through a variety of church contacts and organizations along with Jim Wick. The restaurant meals are provided through Meals Matter Movement and the lunches are prepared by individuals from churches in the support group for Divine Intervention.

### **How can you help?**

Be the Christ Church building representative. Responsibilities include: Disinfect and set up of the outside serving table, signage and cones for distancing; bring up the water from the refrigerator and coolers for keeping food cold/warm; assist with meal drop off and distribution; Disinfect and return coolers, signage, table, to the basement and sanitize the areas used before leaving the church. The time required is 4:45 PM to approximately 6:15 PM on a Friday night of your choosing.

Donate heavy duty disposable plastic forks and knives. Please drop them off at church during office hours or on a Sunday. They can be left outside of the church office.

## **UPDATE: \$5000.00 UCC WISCONSIN CONFERENCE CATALYST GRANT**

Christ Church receives \$5000 UCC Wisconsin Conference Catalyst Grant to support Arts and Science Literacy Micro Pods (ASLMP)

One ministry touching the three Great Loves of the United Church of Christ:

- **LOVE OF CREATION:** A science-based curriculum emphasizing different weekly nature themes
- **LOVE OF NEIGHBOR:** A networked collaboration of seven different churches embracing education for children throughout the city of Milwaukee
- **LOVE OF CHILDREN:** A literacy program directed towards low income or disadvantaged children in grades K3 – 7<sup>th</sup>

A new educational program has been implemented among the churches participating in ASLC. This program coincides with the fall 2020 Milwaukee Public School (MPS) virtual school year. The ASLC Director selected the neediest of our past ASCL students to participate in this pilot project. There are three separate student learning pods, each with a teacher and five children. Participants are offered a morning and afternoon session. MPS virtual learning is supported but extensively supplemented based on the learning styles and special needs of our student body. Arts and science are specifically incorporated into each day's activities.

The student body is comprised of over 50% special needs students with a great emphasis on one-on-one assistance as they navigate their virtual school day. The ethnic composition is 8% African-American, 25% Hispanic, and 67% Caucasian. This program is being conducted at Tippecanoe Presbyterian Church, in the Bay View community.

While many churches find themselves in a maintenance mode as they struggle to navigate the issues generated by the COVID pandemic, our consortium of churches has pioneered a pathway of ministry that addresses the educational needs of children that have previously participated in ASLC.




