Today marks the sixth Sunday after the Epiphany and reach the culmination of our season with Transfiguration Sunday. Epiphany reveals glimpses of Jesus' identity through his miracles, teaching, and preaching. Our Gospel lessons have challenged us with questions about Jesus' divinity and person. This week we conclude our sermon series, *The Light Shines in the Darkness*. This series calls us to shine forth our Christian faith into the world by putting what is in our hearts into action.

In this weekend's Old Testament lesson, the prophet Elijah is whisked up into the heavens by a whirlwind, and his successor, Elisha, takes up the prophetic mantle. In the Gospel reading we hear how Jesus and his friends went up a mountaintop to pray. When they reached the summit, Jesus changed in appearance and the disciples saw his divinity and relationship to God firsthand. His disciples wanted to stay on the mountaintop forever, but Jesus calls them down and back to work. When they go down the mountainside, Jesus and his disciples are immediately intercepted by people who need their help. On St. Valentine's Day, we remember also that God loves us first and foremost, and God calls us to shine forth that love into the world and not to keep it to ourselves.

Old Testament

2 Kings 2:1-12

The prophet Elijah was taken up in a whirlwind to heaven, but not without his protégé, Elisha, following along for the journey beforehand. Time and time again, Elijah warns Elisha to stay behind, but Elisha keeps following him. At Bethel, Elisha is warned that Elijah will be whisked into the heavens, but the younger prophet doesn't listen. At Jericho, Elisha refuses to listen to the advice of the prophets about Elijah's fate. Finally, at the Jordan, Elisha requests a double-portion of Elijah's spirit, and Elijah complies. A whirlwind pulls Elijah into the heavens and Elisha is left to carry on Elijah's prophetic mantle.

New Testament

Jesus, accompanied by the disciples Peter, James, and John, go up a mountainside. When Jesus prays his appearance changes to a bright shining light. During this experience, the sleepy disciples witness a divine reunion between ancestors of their faith and Jesus. Peter declares it is good for the disciples to be on the mountaintop with Jesus. He offers to make a tabernacle for them to live there forever with Moses and Elijah. A cloud envelopes Jesus and tells the disciples to listen to the Son, the Chosen One. When the disciples and Jesus go down the mountaintop the next day, they are immediately encountered by a boy possessed by a spirit that he casts out to everyone's amazement. Jesus explains his impending betrayal and death to his disciples.
